The Book of Genesis, the first book in our Bibles, has been important for both Christians and Jews over the last two thousand years. This Bible Study will explore Genesis: its importance for our understanding of the role of human beings and our place within the scheme of creation, and also the tension between 'chosenness' and God's love for all people, which is part of the ongoing story of the modern Middle East, with all its pain in these present days. Such a journey through Genesis acts as a vital precursor to the journey with Jesus towards a 'new creation' that we are all invited to take during the season of Lent.
